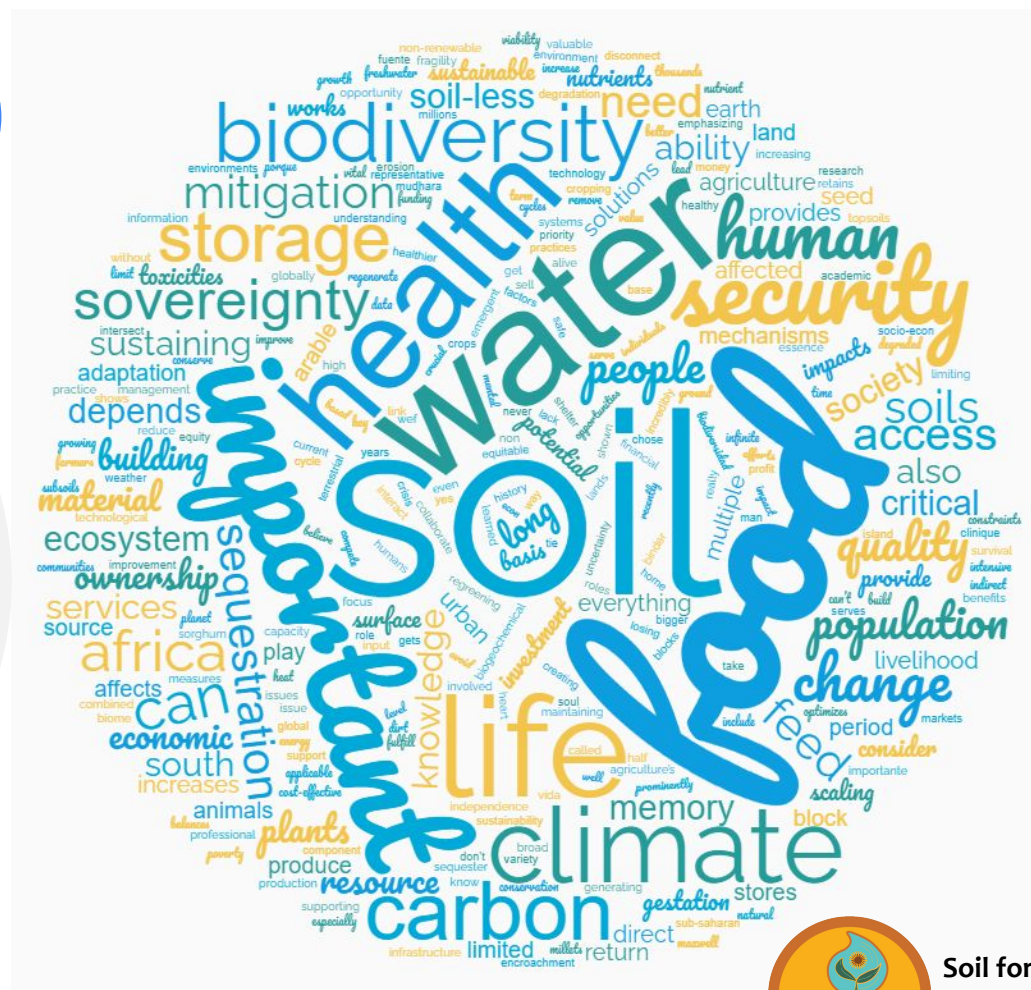


1: Why is soil an important resource?
